- Review historic data to study previous disasters
- Inquire with local agencies to learn about their disaster plans
- Research and stay informed!



2. Are You Prepared?

Response Plans & Survival Kits

Once you know what risks, threats, or hazards exist in your area, formulate a response plan that effectively addresses each of them.

Where To Start?



Partner with neighbors and family for a coordinated response & review



Create a variety of survival kits in case of sheltering in place, vehicle evacuation, and escaping on foot



Review and update plans and kits annually







PRACTICE

- Conduct routine emergency drills with family/home members
- Routinely confirm recommended evacuation routes, shelters, and communication outlets

STAY INFORMED

 Establish multiple lines of communication to ensure that you are informed before, during, and immediately after an event.

NOTE:

In the event that planned options are no longer available, have alternate plans/contingencies in place.





Fortify & Adapt

- Inspect your home and property
- Increase home protection
- Communicate with Disaster Personnel
- Stay informed of new programs or evacuation centers
